Trafford Safeguarding Adults Board (TSAB)

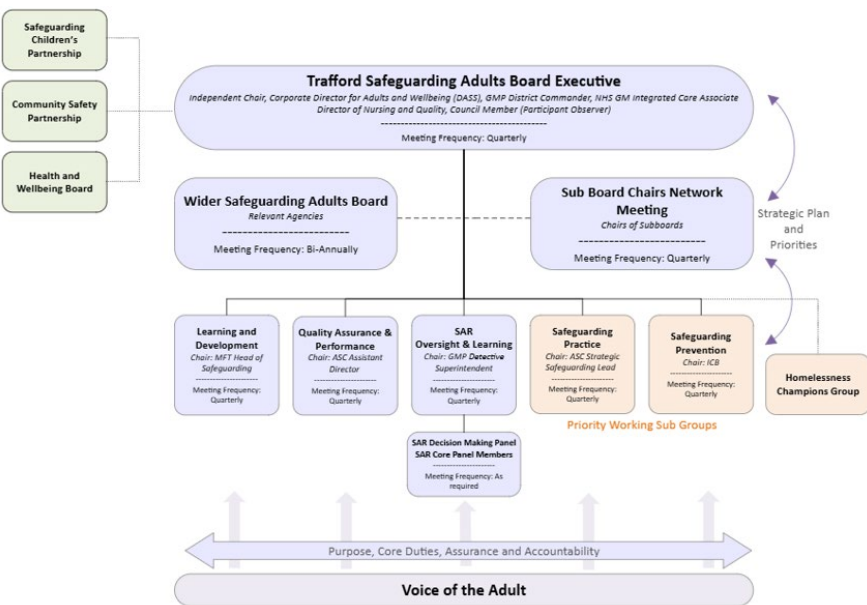
Strategic Plan 2025-2027

TSAB has three core duties:

- Develop and publish a Strategic Plan setting out how objectives will be met and how member and partner agencies will contribute.
- Publish an Annual Report detailing how effective the work has been.
- Commission safeguarding adults' reviews (SARs) for any cases which meet the criteria for these and ensure lessons are learned.

The 2 main purposes for TSAB's Strategic Plan are:

- To specify the actions required by the SAB and each of its member agencies to implement the strategy, including timescales
- To inform the local community and all interested parties, including practitioners, about the work programme of the TSAB.



Our vision for Trafford is a borough in which everyone works together to empower communities to support adults at risk of harm to prevent abuse; and when it does occur, acting swiftly to achieve good outcomes, engaging with, listening to and responding to wishes of people at risk.

Safeguarding Practice

Ensure action is taken to improve practice and outcomes for adults at risk of abuse and neglect.

What we will do:

- Develop and promote a shared language and understanding of adults safeguarding
- Raise Awareness and further embed the principles of Making Safeguarding Personal (MSP)
- Promote understanding and professional confidence in the Legal Literacy for protecting adults at risk, inc. Mental Capacity Assessment.
- Increase awareness of Safeguarding pathways including screening, planning, caused enquiries and safeguarding plans
- Strengthen the interface between the Community Safety Partnership, to ensure a joined-up approach to Domestic Abuse.

How we will do it:

- Develop, launch and embed multi-agency procedures that promote a shared understanding of what constitutes a safeguarding concern.
- Publish and embed a revised adult safeguarding concern referral form
- Review, and as required, further develop arrangements for multi-agency screening of s42 concerns
- Review local approach to Daily Risk Management meetings
- Develop, launch and embed multi agency procedures on caused enquiries and safeguarding plans
- Provide learning and development opportunities that increase understanding and application of Care Act requirements, MSP and MCA
- Review and raise awareness of the safeguarding response required under s42 Care Act to adults with care + support needs who are victims of domestic abuse referred to MARAC.

Safeguarding Prevention

Work together to ensure the prevention of abuse and neglect; acting at the earliest opportunity to reduce the impact of harm.

What we will do:

- Increase awareness of how adults with care and support needs can be abused or neglected and action that can be taken to reduce harm.
- Embed pathways for support and identification for adults who Self-Neglect
- Promote and embed a safeguarding lens and response to rough sleepers
- Promote a safe workforce through effective management and oversight against allegations of People in Positions of Trust.
- Embed and oversee the use of multi-agency guidance for professionals on the treatment of pressure ulcer to ensure appropriate safeguarding responses.

How we will do it:

- Engage with adults with care and support needs to inform a refresh of the content of the TSAB Website.
- Conduct awareness raising campaigns of how adults with care and supports needs can be abused/ neglected including vulnerability factors and the actions to be taken to protect an adult
- Launch a hoarding policy and establish a Hoarders helping Hoarders network
- Produce standalone multi agency safeguarding adult procedures
- Develop, launch and embed a safeguarding adult risk assessment and threshold tool that promotes the 6 safeguarding adults' principles.
- Review and as required further embed a safeguarding response to adults who are rough sleeping including application of MCA.
- Monitor the implementation/impact of MARM.
- Develop and embed a multi-agency People in a Position of Trust (PIPOT) Protocol to support the identification of people who may pose a risk to vulnerable adults.
- Develop multi-agency guidance for professionals working with adults with pressure sores and ensure this guidance is shared widely.

Quality Assurance and Performance

Ensure safeguarding arrangements are effective to ensure change and practice improvements.

What we will do:

- Evaluate the application of the 6 principles of Adult Safeguarding.
- Embed an effective multi-agency performance (data set)
- Evaluate the quality and impact of multi-agency safeguarding practice and the experiences of adults with care and support needs in Trafford.
- Develop arrangements to engage with adults with care and support needs and use their experiences to develop local practice.
- Test how learning Safeguarding Adult Reviews (SARs) and Audits are embedded into practice.
- Seek assurance about actions taken to reduce abuse and neglect, and premature deaths, of adults with learning disabilities.

How we will do it:

- Development and implementation of a Multi-agency QA framework including audit schedule
- Conduct Multi-Agency Audits to identify key areas for learning and ensure local procedures are effective
- Receive & scrutinise quarterly multi agency performance report
- Receive and consider the findings of LEDER annual report and identify any actions required under the auspices of the SAB
- Evaluate the impact of learning and development opportunities on outcomes for adults with care and support needs, practice and partnership working
- Receive an assurance report from Local Authority on the delivery and oversight of safeguarding activity that is delivered by GMMH under s75 agreement.
- Develop an approach to receive feedback from adults with care and support needs who receive safeguarding services and use their insights and expertise to inform SAB activity.
- Establish a practitioner forum to understand the experiences of front-line staff and use their insights and expertise to inform SAB activity.
